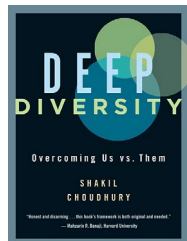
About a third of my time is spent indexing for books. I developed and, for ten years, taught the indexing course for the Ryerson University's Publishing Program.

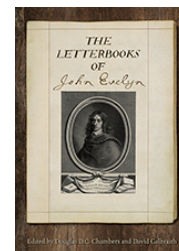
